The delegation led by Mr. Nazir Ayaz, the President of the Queens chapter of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community, USA also included Ghanaian Ahmadis living in the Tristate area. Members assembled at the Ghana Consulate in New York at 2pm and were received by Mr. Harry Reynolds Head of Information, Ghana Mission. After a brief introduction, the delegation met with Ms. Martha Ama Akyaa Pobee, Ghana UN Representative.

Prior to her appointment, Ms. Pobee has been a career diplomat, serving in the Ministry for Foreign Affairs for almost 30 years, most recently as Deputy Head of Mission and Chargé d'affaires at the Ghana High Commission in Pretoria since 2012. Before holding that position, she was Director of the Information and Public Affairs Bureau at the Ministry for Foreign Affairs from 2010 to 2012 and Head of Chancery at the Ghanaian Embassy in Washington, D.C., from 2006 to 2010.



Mr. Nazir Ayaz expressed gratitude on behalf of the Jamaat, for the opportunity to meet with the UN representative and welcomed her to New York. He further outlined the contributions made by the Ahmadi community to the socio-economic development in Ghana, he mentioned Humanity First which is a non-profit organization set up the Ahmadiyya community to help communities worldwide. The New York Regional Tarbiyyat Fitness camp was held from July 31 to Aug 2, 2015 at Bait-uz-Zafar. It was the 29th camp held in New York. In the earlier years, the camp was one week long for boys and one week long for girls and the students would have a sleepover. Later it became day camp, but still one week long. Soon after, it was reduced to 6 days and then eventually to 4 days and now under the national guidelines we hold it for the weekend. The camp began after Juma Prayers and continued for two full days, Saturday and Sunday, with a closing ceremony in which certificates were awarded to all those who attended all three days.

Education Day 2015

On Sunday evening of August 9, 2015, the Ta'lim Department held its Annual Education Day Event (EDE) to recognize students from all ages for their academic achievements in the recent school year. While all students and parents were encouraged to participate, only those who submitted documentation for their scholastic accomplishments were ultimately given awards.

The program began after Asr prayer with recitation of the Holy Qur'an and translation by Haseeb Mirza. After a brief introduction about the Ta'lim Department, its upcoming programs and available services to students, I presented our two student speakers.

The first address was given by Kamal Mohamed who spoke about his experience as a fifth grader.
