Waqfe-Nau Report

On January 11, 2014, the Queens Jama'at held its first waqf-e-nau meeting of the year. The meeting began with the recitation of Surah Al-Imran v. 96-98 with translation, recited by Haseeb Mirza. Danial Mahmood then gave the Urdu translation of these versus. Following the tilawat, Alisha Robeena recited the hadith "People Are Like a Teeth of Comb" with translation. Afterwards, Saba Noorin recited couplets 4-6 of the gaseedah with translation and Maherah Mohar also recited "Ho Fazl Tayrah Ya Rab".

Prior to the various presentations, Farah Ahmad gave a short introduction about herself, her family, and the reason behind why she waqfed her children. The first presentation was that of Danish Chaudhry who did a PowerPoint on Hazrat Umar Farooq (ra). The PowerPoint was a well-organized history on Hazrat Umar Farooq's (ra) life, as well as his time as a companion of the Holy Prophet (saw) and his life as a khalifa. Following Danish's PowerPoint, Amatul Hayee Marium gave a PowerPoint presentation on Hazrat Noah (as). Marium spoke of Hazrat Noah's (as) lineage, family, legacy, and the consequences of the disbelievers of his time. Afterwards, Amara Mahmood gave a PowerPoint presentation on the Q&A session of a Nasirat waqf-e-nau class in July 2012 in Canada. The Question and Answer session ranged from various questions including purdah, women's roles in careers, and the piousness of an Ahmadi wedding.

Towards the end of the meeting, the regional waqf-e-nau secretary, Dr. Nadeem Ahmad congratulated the Queens Jamaat on how far their waqifeen have come. He also reminded us of the upcoming waqifeen ijtema, and urged all children to participate according to their age groups. Our Waqqifeen secretary concluded the meeting by once again reminding us to remain steadfast in our Namaz, Quran, and Friday Sermons. Humanity First Team Travels to Guatemala to Give Gift of Health

The Humanity First USA team of medical, student and general volunteers arrived on December 18, 2013 in Guatemala to serve humanity on the third Gift of Health trip of 2013 with the support of Humanity First Guatemala.

In the first three days, they saw over 1300 patients at the Gift of Health mobile clinic in Santo Domingo Xenocaj. This municipality has no major hospital in the area and only a small clinic with a nurse, so the benefit of Humanity First's presence is invaluable. In the three days at the clinic in San Juan Alcotenango, they saw over 1600 patients. At both locations, Each patient saw a physician in the pediatric or general medicine area, and then received free medications in the pharmacy. Prior to the clinic, all student volunteers had created over 800 hygiene packs by collecting donations of toothbrushes, toothpastes, toys, and other direly needed health care supplies, which they are now distributing to patients and children. Many of the physicians had also connected donations of medications and supplies. The educator had conducted a toy drive at school and spent part of her days playing with and handing out toys to the children at the clinics.

The trip was organized under the leadership of Dr. Naeem Lughmani, Medical Director of Humanity First USA along with the support of Gift of Health coordinator, Saifra Khan. The team on ground includes two physicians from USA, Dr. Khaula Rehman and Dr. Tahira Khalid, Akram Khalid, a physician from Canada, Dr. Kashif Ahmed, physician assistant Saba Ali, medical student Anesia McRae, educator Farida Ahmad and student volunteers from across the US: Tayyab Shah, Yousuf Shah, Aman Ahmad, Umar Momen, Moghees Hanif, Adal Malik, and Ayma Malik.

The Humanity First Guatemala team is led by David Gonzalez, Executive Director of Humanity First Guatemala, and includes 14 volunteers who are assisting in translation, pharmacy, and other logistics. The ground team had worked tirelessly in the past month to prepare for the arrival of the Gift of Health team.

The entire team of volunteers begins their day early at 7 am, and the clinic continues late into the night until the patients clear out. The entire team is working very hard and serving humanity, welcoming each patient, family and child with a smiling face. Humanity First is taking lead in serving Humanity in Guatemala.

Khuddam Food & Clothing Drive

A clothing and canned food drive was done by Queens NY Majlis in December -January 2014. Alhamdulliah, a total collection of 80+ boxes of clothing were collected that consisted winter coats, hats, pants, shirts, shoes for men, women and children. Most of the items were collected from young students at Razi School in Queens NY where an Ahmadi sister works as a teacher. When the school found out about Humanity First organization from our Ahmadi sister, they wanted to give their donation of items to help the people in need. Thanks to the help from several Queens khuddam, all the boxed items were transported to Queens masjid for storage. The clothing/Food drive continued in January 2014 and more items of clothing and canned foods were collected from local Jama'at members. At the end of the drive the entire collection of items were donated to a local shelter operated by Volunteers of America in Queens, NY.

Manhattan Halga Report:

The Manhattan hulqa held its first monthly meeting in 2014 on 26 January. The meeting was attended by several members, in addition to Imam sahib Daud Hanif and Sadr sahib Nazir Ayaz. The meeting was opened with tilawat by Muhsin Shahid.

This was followed by some remarks from Sadr sahib - who underscored the standing meetings of the auxiliary organizations on every first Sunday of the month, which everyone should attend - before the hulqa heard from Imam sahib.

Imam sahib made several important points. First, Imam sahib reminded us that the tilawat to open a formal meeting should be read, not recited from memory. He recalled that even a hafiz al-Qur'an would read from the Holy Book, with his finger tracing the words, so that his whole being, in every sense, was part of the recitation of the Holy Qur'an. The hulqa will thus ensure to read a section from the Holy Qur'an at its next meetings, rather than rely on recitation from memory.

Second, Imam sahib spoke about the need for recitation of the Holy Qur'an that isn't just internal but loud and audible - not just so that one can hear and partake in the recitation but also, and this is especially important, so that the children of a household become used to hearing the Holy Qur'an and benefit from being used to the practice.

In this vein, third, Imam sahib spoke more generally about the need to ensure that children grow up being familiar with the practices of Islam. Families should say congregational prayers together so that the children become used to this, and they should see their parents engage in prayer or in the recitation of the Holy Qur'an. The children should be immersed in the relevant practices from an early age on even if they don't take part yet themselves. Against this background, Imam sahib also encouraged the members of the hulqa to be in close(r) touch with one another and to encourage each other not only by means of the monthly hulqa meeting but also through other contact between the families. Members of the hulqa spoke about their views and experiences, particularly as concerns the responsibilities parents have vis-a-vis their children. Members also referred to the importance of the hulqa meetings as a way of keeping in touch.

The hulqa also discussed ways to facilitate transportation to Bait-uz-Zafar, and insha'allah members will coordinate with one another in the future. The ladies of the hulqa also continued work on their syllabus


